Theme of the Conference is 'Responsibility and Accountability: Strengthening Evidence Generation, Dissemination and Use to Improve Policy Reforms and Sustainable Development Agenda.' The Conference aims to identify and discuss accountability and responsibilities of stakeholders in the use of evidence to address developmental needs.
