OBJECTIVES OF VOUCHER PROGRAM

- Sustainably promote the use of fertilizer and improved seeds by smallholder farmers;
- Sustainably increasing agricultural production;
- Increased income and well-being of the farmers;

VOUCHER PROGRAM IN MOZAMBIQUE

- Voucher program funded by European Union, implemented by Mozambican government (Agriculture Ministry), FAO, and IFDC;
- ➤ The vouchers distributed to selected producers by DPA through the Rural Extension Services;
- ≥ 2 year program 2009-2010 and 2010-2011, 25,000 vouchers of maize and rice in 5 provinces (Manica, Tete, Nampula, Zambézia, Sofala);
- ➤ Voucher gave 73% subsidy on package of 12.5 kg of improved seeds (either OPV or hybrid) for maize or 40 kg of rice seed, and 100kg of fertilizer (50Kg Urea and 50Kg NPK);

SELECTION CRITERIA OF BENEFICIARIES

- Farming a minimum of 0.5 ha up to 5 ha of land;
- Progressive and working towards becoming commercial;
- Interested in participating in the purchasing power support voucher program and willing/able to pay the farmer portion up front;
- Willingness to follow the recommended crop production technology package (12.5 kg of maize seed or 40 kg of rice seed; and bag of 50 kg Urea and 50 kg NPK 12-24-12);







SELECTION CRITERIA & RANDOMIZATION FOR STUDY

- Selection of villages based on 2 criteria:
- Voucher program in the Manica Province
- Access to Banco Oportunidade for savings intervention



SELECTION CRITERIA & RANDOMIZATION FOR STUDY

- Selection of farmers:
- Beneficiary of voucher program;
- Lists and distribution made by government agricultural extension, under the supervision of IFDC;
- Participants informed that half will be selected;
- Randomization: within each village, 50% of participants gained the right to receive a voucher;

BASIC SAVINGS

- Accounts offered in "basic savings" treatment are standard savings accounts normal interest rate, with financial training.
- Savings intervention included information sessions, games, distribution of leaflets, etc.
- Meeting with group representatives, twice per season;

SAVINGS ACCOUNTS AND MATCH SAVINGS

- Accounts offered in "basic savings" treatment are standard savings accounts Normal interest rate, with financial training.
- Savings intervention included information sessions, games, etc.
- Savings match: 50% of minimum balance over match period
- Matching funds capped at MT1500 (~\$54) Match period:
- August 1 October 31 Two years of match promised: 2011 and 2012
- Transfers done in first week of November before time to purchase inputs
- Designed with agricultural cycle in mind Match period ends immediately prior to start of next planting season If save full amount (MT3000), savings + match can purchase input package sufficient for 3/4 hectare maize plot;
